Customised Training

Such training is conducted on the client's premises, or at our offices in Port Melbourne, and can be tailored to meet specific needs. We can also offer training via our internet-base training facility. Our training staff can offer individual training or can conduct small workshops for two or three of your staff.

We offer customised training in the following Inmagic software products: TextWorks, *WebPublisher PRO* and *Genie*. Customised training gives you the flexibility to ensure that your specific needs are met. The training can cover one or two very specific topics (for example, scripting in TextWorks, canned search links in *WebPublisher PRO*, or search screen customisations in *Genie*), or can follow one of the organised courses listed below under "Training Courses". Depending on your needs, we can use sample databases or we can even use your own databases, which makes the training more concrete and realistic for the staff members involved.

Training Courses

In addition to our popular customised training options, Maxus Australia also offers formal courses in the technical aspects of Inmagic® DB/TextWorks® or DB/TextWorks for SQL, and *Web Publisher Pro*. We run structured courses at recognised training venues in most capital cities. Our courses are run by patient and experienced technical staff.

Here are full details of the courses that are currently available:

1. Introductory TextWorks

The **Introduction to Inmagic DB/TextWorks or DB/TextWorks for SQL** is a one-day course designed for new users of TextWorks. By the end of this course the participant should be able to use the DB/Text Works program to create textbases, conduct searches, produce reports and maintain textbases. This very comprehensive course covers searching, Boolean (AND, OR, NOT) techniques, sorting records, editing records, creating a textbase, defining field types, designing a menu screen, and designing forms.



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2. Advanced TextWorks Modules

Module 1

- **Advanced Form Design in TextWorks** is designed for those with strong experience with form design. It covers those aspects of form design that our clients have asked us to explain in greater detail – specifically: self-adhesive labels such as mailing labels and library labels; business letters; email messages; calculations; and headers and footers.

The Advanced Form Design module is offered as a half-day course.

Module 2

- **Thesaurus Construction and Management** covers the construction and maintenance of a monohierarchical, controlled-vocabulary thesaurus using the built-in thesaurus facility.
- **Linking Textbases** covers such topics as: characteristics of link fields; working with link fields; searching a secondary textbase; editing secondary records. This exercise is especially useful to those who work in a library environment and can use linking to create separate catalogue, loans and borrower textbases.
- The **Customisation** exercises give an introduction to customising toolbars, designating options (e.g. text fonts and search term highlighting), re-sizing toolbar buttons, and managing textbase elements such as report forms and query screens.

The Thesaurus, Linking and Customisation sessions are offered together as a half-day module. This module may also be taken in conjunction with the Advanced Form Design module as a full-day workshop.

3. Web Publisher Pro

Web Publisher Pro is a day long, in-depth class designed to give you a head start in mounting your Text Works textbases on the internet or your intranet. It introduces participants to the design of a web search screen, exporting the search screen from Text Works to the web, viewing records in a *Web Publisher Pro* report and designing report and display forms for use with *Web Publisher Pro*.
